Hulston Cancer Center Radiology Suite Campaign Complete

Thank you to all the incredibly generous donors who supported the campaign to build a new Radiology Suite for cancer patients at CoxHealth. The Hulston Family Foundation offered a one-to-one matching gift up to \$1.25 million. The match has been met and the construction of the suite is being scheduled for summer of 2026.

The Suite will include a CT machine, MRI and X-ray with plans for a PET scanner in the future. This Suite will reduce wait times and provide the convenience to cancer patients of having diagnostics, physicians, and treatment options all in one location. Our heartfelt thanks to all who donated to bring this new service to cancer patients.

Dining for Diabetes, the "Met In Monett"

The proceeds benefit the Diabetes Education Program at Cox Monett Hospital. This incredibly successful program reports 47.4 % of patients lowering their A1, 30% achieving a 5-10 % reduction in body weight through lifestyle change and greater than 90% who are actively increasing their physical activity for a healthier life.

EMS HEROs are funded through Federal Grant

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) has awarded the CoxHealth Foundation a million dollars for HERO: **H**elping train **E**MS in the **R**ural **O**zarks. This grant for the CoxHealth EMS services benefits five rural Missouri counties. It will be used to train new EMT's living in those communities, filling the crucial need for trained EMS workers.

This funding has also allowed CoxHealth's Pre-Hospital Services to acquire high-tech equipment to provide training to more than 45 rural police, fire and emergency departments. HERO will also purchase simulation manikins to use in training emergency services workers to provide the highest standard of care to critically injured patients—both adult and pediatric.



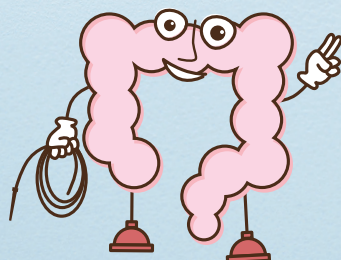
FACT:

Colo-Rectal Awareness Party Highlights Colonoscopy Program

Colon Cancer Awareness Month was kicked off with the annual CRAP fundraiser. The **Colo-Rectal Awareness Program** provides free colonoscopies for patients who need but can't afford this important prevention test.

Colonoscopies can remove pre-cancerous polyps, in effect stopping cancer before it starts.

This year's CRAP event on March 6th brought in \$200,000 for the program and highlighted CoxHealth's new program of online screening and scheduling without the need to see a physician first.
